To that end, Lisbeth Claus, Ph.D., SPHR, GPHR, professor of global HR at the Atkinson Graduate School of Management of Willamette University in Salem, Oregon was commissioned by International SOS to research, analyze and provide solutions around the topic of Duty of Care. Duty of Care can seem like a daunting topic, but it doesn't have to be. A new white paper reviews an employer's Duty of Care responsibilities for their employees (and dependents) who cross borders as part of their work duties. The overall goal of this paper is to inform decision makers

about these responsibilities-putting it on the radar screen--but at the same time, offering innovative solutions that will help organizations plan, organize and develop an appropriate integrated risk management strategy. Dr. Claus will further give a workshop that will enable attendees to have a better understanding of the risks organizations and employees face while traveling or living abroad as well as how companies can utilize existing and new resources to build an integrated risk management program, thus effectively fulfilling its Duty of Care. These sessions will conclude with guest speakers who will share their best practices around keeping their globe-trotting employees healthy, safe, and secure.
